Crime Prevention Policy

- Premises should give consideration on how to prevent disorder, thefts and drug misuse within the venue. Walking the floor, trained glass collectors, toilet checks and toilet attendant are examples of good practice in this area.
- Consideration should also be given to the prevention of crime. This may include the use of security lockers, crime prevention literature and other initiatives.
- You should consider use of anti-drink spiking devices.
- Staff should have an awareness of the early signs of aggression and there should be clearly defined procedures in place for early intervention.
- A clearly worded policy, stating when to call door supervisors, the management or the police is considered best practice.
